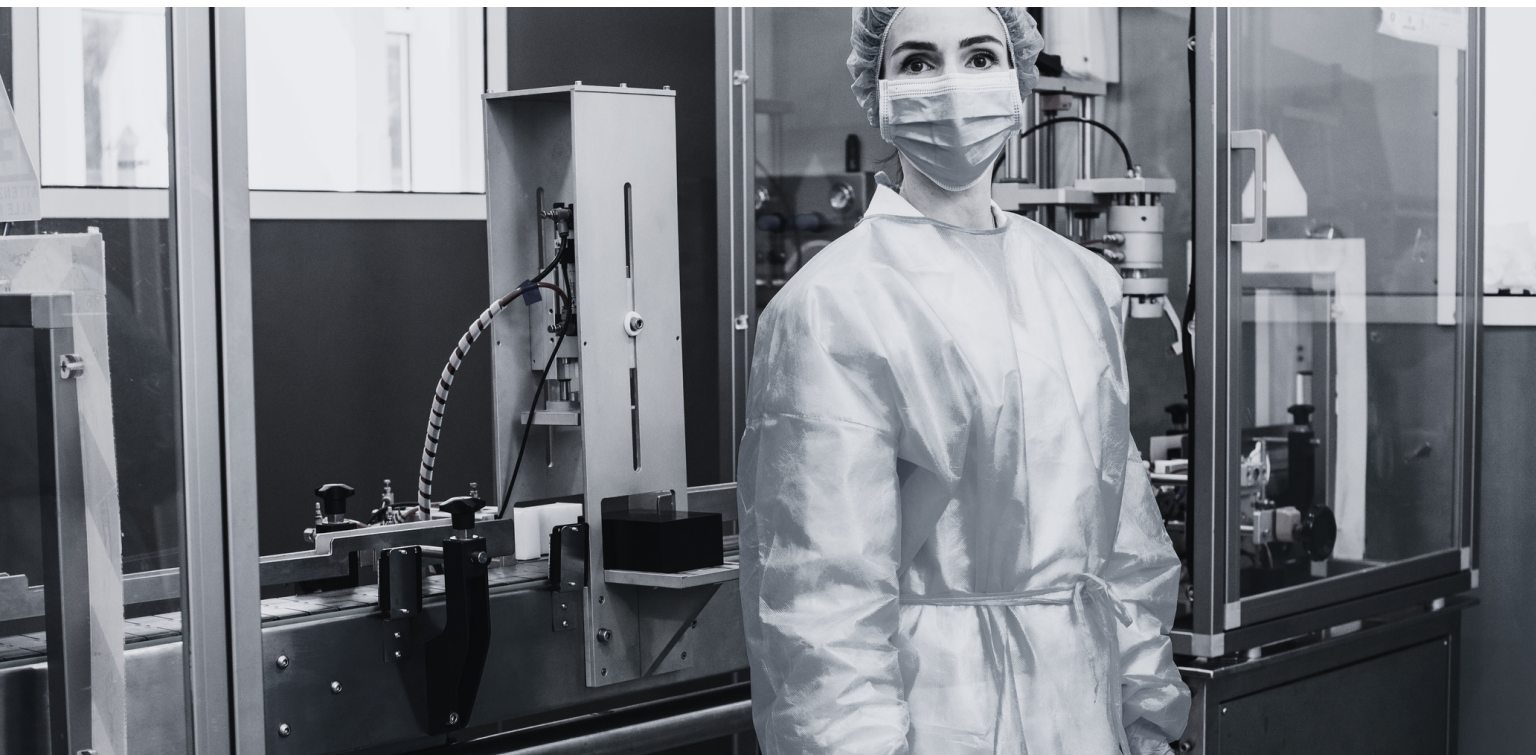

We aim for people **to see and understand the clinical engineering** profession around the world and acknowledge **women's contributions, actions, and global efforts.**

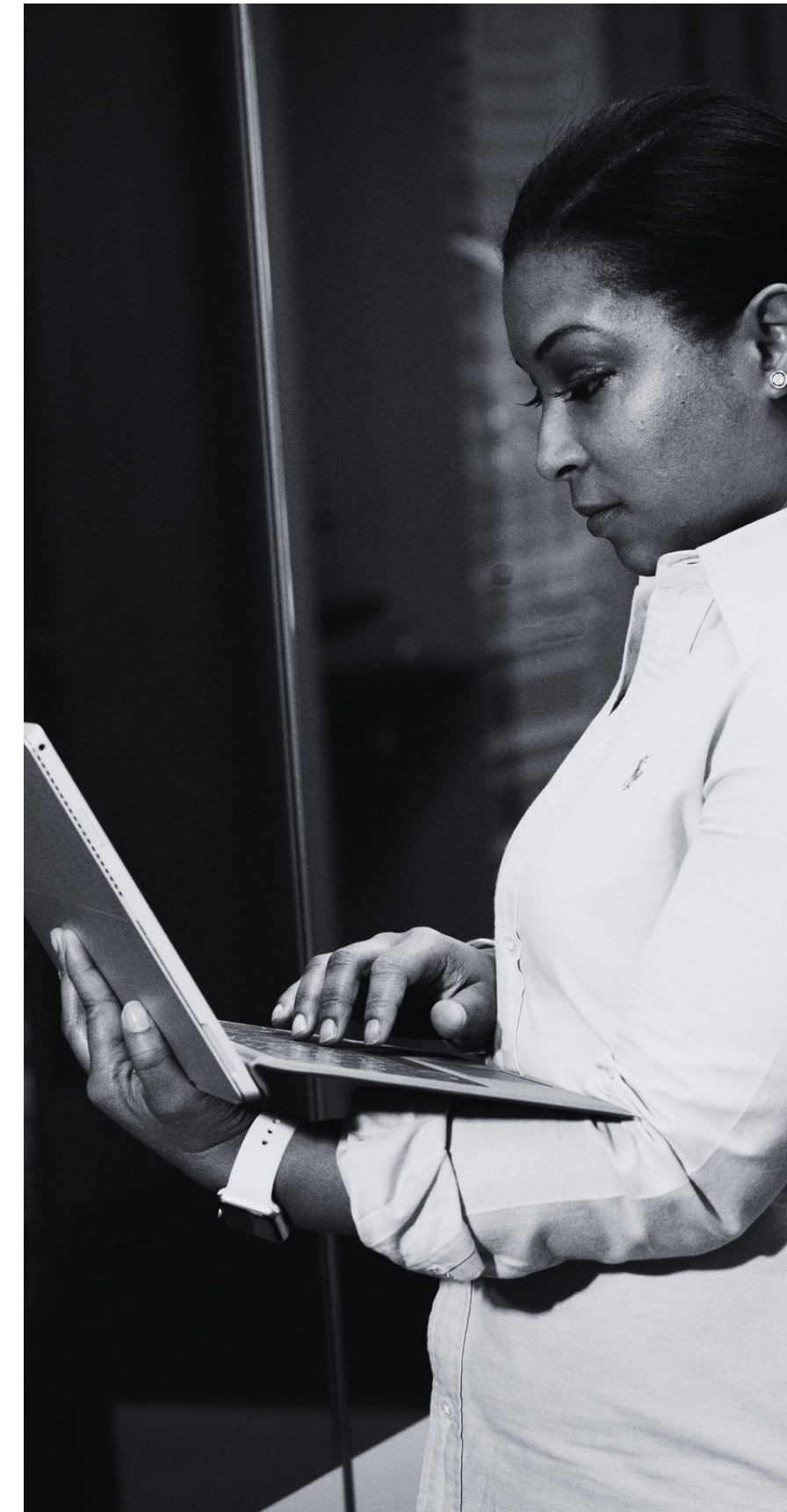
We aim for young girls **to get inspired and develop a career** in the clinical engineering field, as well as **encourage young CE** careers.

PHOTO SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS



- Photographs must be the author's property, original and unpublished; photomontages or AI pictures are not accepted.
- Send your photographs in JPEG format with a resolution of at least 12 MP and a maximum weight of 10 Mb (size 10 x15 cm).
- Each photograph must include the author's name, a title, the place and date of the shooting, and a brief description (300 words).
- Each photograph must include written permission for use in IFMBE CED activities.



WICE Project

Code of ethics: Photographs showing identifiable persons must be accompanied by a letter authorizing their appearance on the picture. Likewise, each photograph must be accompanied by a certificate of authorship. **Download these formats here: <https://bit.ly/3Nkr7U5>**

CATEGORIES

01

Women at Work

Women in their work environments, doing their jobs and showcasing their skills. This category will focus more on the technical aspects of the role of women in the CE career.

02

Women in Leadership

Women who hold leadership positions within the field of clinical engineering, such as managers, directors, or executives; to capture images that show their leadership qualities, such as communication, decision-making, and strategic thinking, showing the impact of women in their teams, departments, and organizations.

03

Women Making a Difference

Photos that show a positive impact beyond their daily work duties: women who are working on projects or initiatives that benefit their community, organization, or the broader field of CE. Focus on how their work is making a difference in the lives of others (social and community impact).

04

Women in Education

Women in their teaching or research activities, as well as, the impact they have on their students or the broader field of clinical engineering.
